CS Lewis: Oxford professor of literature

If he (the Bible critic) tells me that something in a Gospel is legend or romance, I want to know how many legends and romances he has read, how well his palate is trained in detecting them by their flavor, not how many years he has spent on that Gospel. I have been reading poems, romances, vision-literature, legends, and myths all my life. I know what they are like. I know that not one of them are like this. Of the Gospel texts, there are only two possible views; either this is reportage, or else, some unknown ancient writer without, known predecessors or successors suddenly anticipated the whole technique of modernistic, novelistic, realistic narrative. The reader who doesn't see this simply has not learned to read.
